


MSCI World Consumer Discretionary 35/20 Capped Index (USD)

The **MSCI World Consumer Discretionary 35/20 Capped Index** is based on MSCI World index, its parent index and is designed to measure the performance of the large and mid cap representation across 23 Developed Markets (DM) countries*. All securities in the index are classified in the Consumer Discretionary sector as per the Global Industry Classification Standard (GICS®). The weight of the largest issuer in the index is constrained to 35% and the weights of all other entities are constrained to a maximum of 20%.




